As we remember and pray now for those who are having to face the future without the physical presence of a loved one, we are reminded that, as Christians, we find comfort in the full and certain knowledge that Jesus Christ is the Light of the World, a light which no darkness can quench. We remember before God those who have died, and light a candle to symbolise the light of Christ which eternally shines and brings hope. *Pray for The Diocese of Chichester – The Church of England (Canterbury Province) (Anglican Cycle of Prayer)*
